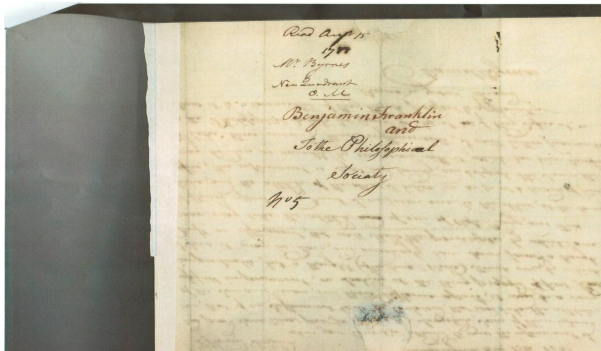
# What is The Hale Byrnes House

- Fully non-profit organization

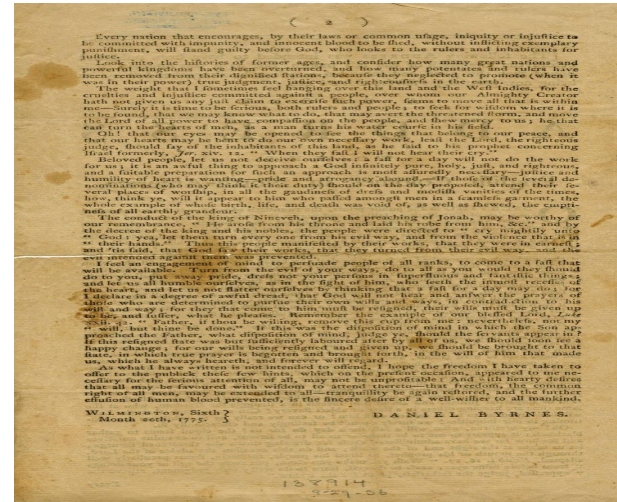


# History Behind the House

The earliest parts of this house dates back to 1750. This house was a common meeting spot during the American Revolution. On September 6th, 1777, George Washington held a war council at the Hale Byrnes House to discuss the plan of defense for Philadelphia. The main reason this house is still standing today is because of Lafayette. The Hale Byrnes House is where Lafayette attended a meeting.

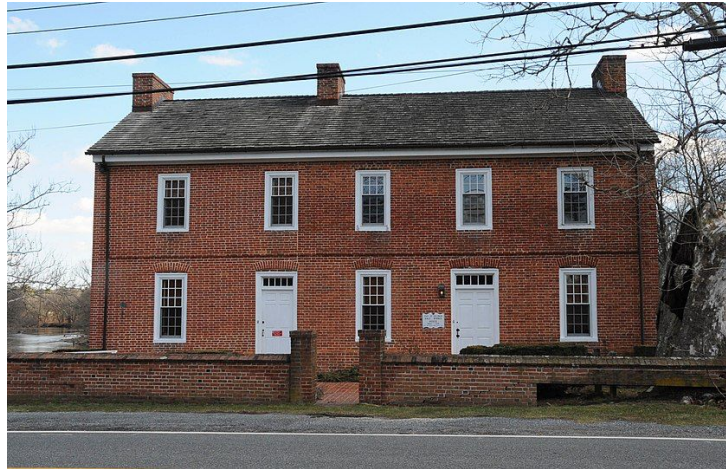
